Catholic Urban Programs services are available to individuals who meet eligibility requirements and are contingent upon available funding.

Who are we, what do we offer to the community?

Catholic Urban Programs (CUP) was founded in 1973 as a department of the Diocese of Belleville by Mr. Joe Hubbard. CUP serves people in need throughout the Diocese with a concentration on East St. Louis and surrounding communities. Our social service programs work in collaboration to help meet the needs of our community's most vulnerable. As we build relationships with those we serve, we walk with Two Feet of Love in Action, helping to meet basic needs while empowering people to reach stability and self-sufficiency.

Our Mission

Guided by the principles of Catholic social teaching, we advance human dignity, remediate the effects of poverty, and empower people to become self-sufficient through crisis intervention, housing security, and out-of-school time programs.

Programs and Services offered

The HUB (Housing, Utilities, Basic Needs) is a centralized access point to CUP's crisis intervention service. Issues that are relatively minor inconveniences for most people can lead to devastating outcomes for families already burdened with the costs of meeting their basic needs. Catholic Urban Programs steps in with short-term solutions to help stabilize families in times of crisis.

- Rental assistance
- Utility assistance (Call Mon – Fri 618-398-5616 ext. 213 or Li-Heap 618-257-9246)
- Funeral and burial support (Call Tue, Wed, Thur 618-398-5616)
- Assistance with beds and appliances in emergent situations such as fire or securing housing after a period of homelessness.

HUB FOODS (OPEN 9AM – 12PM & 1PM – 3PM TUE, WED & THUR, EXCEPT HOLIDAYS)

The flagship program of "The HUB" location of Catholic Urban Programs is HUB Foods. The new pantry program opened to the public in July 2020 and has been received very positively by those who visit. In the new model, clients "shop" for their food, much like in a grocery

store. The pantry is organized by food groups, with the first section being fresh produce. Clients select items from each shelf based on their family size. The option to choose one's own food fosters an atmosphere of respect and builds trust among pantry guests, volunteers, and staff. HUB Foods is currently serving more than 100 households each month. Our goal is to create a robust membership program through which we build relationships with those we serve, helping to identify and remove barriers to stability and self-sufficiency through connections to CUP's ancillary services and/or other community organizations.

HOLY ANGELS SHELTER & HOUSING SERVICES (INTAKE TO THE SHELTER IS THROUGH A CENTRALIZED REFERRAL SYSTEM. CONTACT THE HOUSING RESOURCE CENTER AT 618-825-3330)

Having affordable, safe and stable places to live anchors families and individuals, enabling them to reach their full potential in all areas of their lives. CUP housing security efforts focus first on preventing homelessness. For families experiencing homelessness at our Holy Angels Shelter, we concentrate on personalized, intensive case management services aimed at moving them back to self-sufficiency as quickly as possible. Seeing our clients obtain housing that is both permanent and safe is the ultimate goal.

HOMELESS PREVENTION

In addition to being what is best for families and individuals, the most cost-effective way to deal with the issues of homelessness is to prevent it from happening.

CUP's homeless prevention focus includes:

- Rental assistance (first month's rent and security deposit).
- Housing arrears and utility support for those facing eviction.

HOLY ANGELS EMERGENCY SHELTER

Holy Angels is an 18-bed, 24/7 shelter program serving single women, mothers with children, and intact families. In addition to meeting basic needs of safety, food, clothing, and shelter, CUP's intensive case management program is centered on personalized housing stability plans.

EMERGENCY MOTEL

Partnership with the Illinois Department of Human Services, and with funds contributed by private individuals, CUP delivers emergency motel nights for people in short-term housing crises, including victims of issues such as domestic violence. The voucher program adds capacity when shelters are full and keeps families together and safe until permanent housing solutions are found.

ANCHORS SAFE AND PERMANENT HOUSING PROGRAM

ANCHORS is Catholic Urban Programs' trauma-informed housing security program that addresses the safety and well-being needs of

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clients residing in the East St. Louis Public Housing Developments. This innovative initiative is in response to feedback from some Griffin Center families who are currently paying market-rate rent in public housing. These clients report feeling “stuck” due to the lack of savings for security deposit and first month’s rent. This strategic effort is aimed at helping move families living in unsafe, violent and deteriorating public housing into safer neighborhoods to enhance their physical and mental well-being.

GRIFFIN CENTER

Griffin Center programming is focused on breaking the cycle of intergenerational poverty for children in East St. Louis Public Housing through a multi-faceted approach that includes:

- After School Programming and Summer Camps at five public housing sites
- Advocacy and academic monitoring of participants in collaboration with their respective schools
- Second Step method Violence prevention training

The Griffin Center serves approximately 200 children each year. At the highest level, the Center defines success in terms of the number of children in the program performing academically at grade level. Their Success is Our Success.

Watch List - The Griffin Center watch list program was created to help Center staff keep track of children with GPAs of 2.0 and below. Students on the watch list are given extra academic and social-emotional support needed to help improve school attendance and overall academic performance.

Academic Performance - Over the past five years, Griffin Center participants achieved the following results: Honor Roll attainment rose from 34% to 44%, and watch list placements decreased from 34% to 16%, resulting in more on-grade promotions.

 - d. Organizations - Organizations are listed alphabetically and include contact information, services offered, possible cost and eligibility requirements; pg. 23 – 44
3. If using a digital version of the Community Resource Guide, click on the hyperlinks to be directed to the information within the document or you can scroll through the pages looking for the information needed.
4. Have a paper and pencil ready to take notes when you make a call or review the website.
5. Visit the organization's website or call the organization for more information or to apply for their services.
 - a. If calling, be ready to give a brief but complete account of your need, eliminating unrelated information. You may be asked to provide your name, contact information, and where you can be reached, if needed.
6. Take notes during the call including the name and titles of people you talk to and confirm their phone number. Keep your notes together on all your contacts to each organization so you can supply information when you make a follow up call.
7. Remember to say thank you to those who assist you!
